




Welcome

On June 3, 2012, 470 delegates and 110 staff members from across Kansas converged on the campus of Kansas State University to participate in the 75th session of the American Legion Boys State of Kansas Leadership Academy. History

"To inculcate a sense of individual obligation to the community, state and nation." That is the purpose of the American Legion Boys State program. It was organized by the Department of Illinois in 1935. The Department of Kansas, holding Charter No. 5, was among the first to institute this weeklong government-in-action program.

The American Legion Boys State of Kansas was headquartered in Wichita for 26 years before moving to the University of Kansas in 1963. It stayed there until 1992 when the program moved to its present location on the campus of Kansas State University.

The Boys State program is available to any high school senior-to-be who meets academic criteria and demonstrates leadership potential. Civic and church groups as well as American Legion Posts sponsor delegates to this fine learning-by-doing, youth-in-government program.

Almost 50,000 young men from across Kansas have participated in Boys State and performed nearly every function of city, county, and state government. Former delegates, members of the American Legion, and Sons of the American Legion return each year to serve as counselors and advisors. Many of them work year-round on ways to improve the curriculum and structure of the program.

At the conclusion of each session, two Staters are chosen by their peers to represent Kansas at the American Legion Boys Nation in Washington, D.C. These two individuals participate in a learning-by-doing program that focuses on our government at the national level.




Sunday






- 1. Kansas Senator Anthony Hensley (a former Kansas Boys Stater) presents his keynote address to the delegates at Opening Ceremonies.
- 2. Advisor Rex Gardner talks to a group of Boys State delegates and their parents before they go through the check-in process.
























Tuesday























Wednesday




Thursday




















Friday


