## Scholarship

Eligible participants\* can apply for a Samsung scholarship through The American Legion. Meant to show appreciation for U.S. veterans who came to South Korea's aid during its struggle against communist forces in the Korean War, the Samsung Corporation endowed a \$5 million scholarship fund through the American Legion. Winners are selected according to academic record, involvement in school and community service.

Scholarship applications are submitted online and due by 11:59 p.m. on June 4, 2023.

- Ten National Scholars receive \$10,000 each (two from each region)
- Ten National Runners-Up receive \$5,000 each (two from each region)
- One Department (State) finalist will be awarded a \$1,250 scholarship

## What is Boys State?

Boys State is a "learning by doing" exercise that simulates elections, political parties and government at the state, county and local levels, providing opportunities to lead under pressure, showcasing character and working effectively within a team. It's also an opportunity to gain pride and respect for government, and the price paid by members of the military to preserve democracy.


## Fees

The fee for Kansas Boys State is \$350. This primarily pays for a week of food & lodging. In most situations a delegate or their family pays \$50, and a sponsoring organization pays the remaining \$300.


## Sponsors



## New for 2023

Boys State has partnered with Kansas State University Rec Center personal training staff to conduct daily conditioning for athletes preparing for Fall sports. Delegates can now participate in Boys State activities while fulfilling the varsity sports training obligations. No additional fee is required for this option.



## College and Career Fair

Universities, colleges, technical, vocational schools, law enforcement, military academies, and the Kansas National Guard attend the College and Career Fair. Delegates can communicate directly with admissions personnel and learn more about programs and scholarship opportunities. More than 30 institutions attended in 2022.
